

After School Project, Ukraine

Project Aims

This project supports children aged 7-12 whose education has been disrupted by the war in Ukraine. It will:

- Provide additional tutoring by trained teachers in Ukrainian language, English, mathematics, physics and history.
- Offer a safe, supervised environment so parents can work or manage essential responsibilities with peace of mind.
- Build children's confidence and wellbeing through self-development activities, including hygiene and anti-human trafficking (AHT) awareness, crafts and games.

Summary

Children taking part will receive tailored academic support to close learning gaps and reduce the conflict's impact on their education. Alongside this, they will learn practical self-care and safety skills - with age-appropriate guidance on trust, hygiene and anti-trafficking awareness - reinforced through engaging activities such as crafts and games. These sessions help reduce stress and trauma, with access to a professional psychologist when required.

Each corps will run a safe space for up to 20 children, operating four days a week. Qualified teachers will lead learning, supported by a psychologist as needed. Children will receive a full hot lunch and a snack, enabling them to spend time after school in an engaging, supportive environment with their peers while parents attend work or other responsibilities.

Basic Needs Provision, Ukraine

Project Aims

This project aims to uphold the wellbeing of people in Ukraine who are displaced or otherwise affected by the conflict by ensuring rapid, equitable access to essential support. The Salvation Army will distribute basic supplies such as food, water, hygiene items, blankets, linen, baby products and other essentials to people that have been internally displaced due to the conflict. Where possible, The Salvation Army will offer voucher-based assistance to offer dignity and choice.

Summary

This project will continue a series of Salvation Army initiatives responding to the ongoing conflict. Corps buildings will serve as safe, accessible locations for distributing essential items, conducting training, offering limited storage and providing practical support. Using a voucher-first model to enhance dignity and choice, corps teams will also distribute blankets and bed linen where required, operate warm hubs with heat, power and meals, and purchase essential equipment - such as refrigerators for food storage - to keep services running. The project will target approximately 5,000 people, or around 1,700 families.
