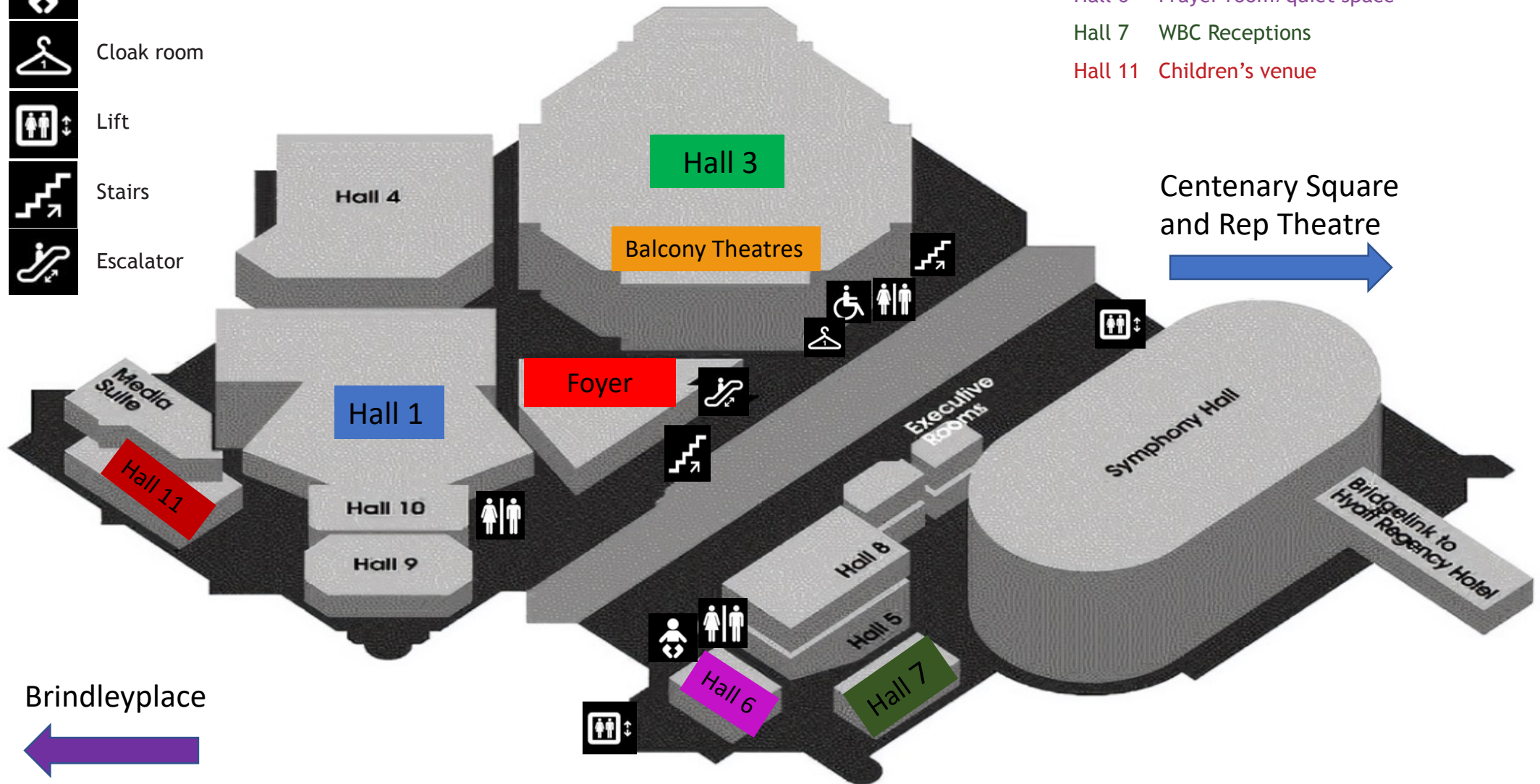

Accessibility Information

We are committed to making Together 2022 an enjoyable experience for everyone. For full details of our accessibility information go to salvationist.org.uk/events/together22

- The ICC is fully accessible for wheelchair users using both ramps and lifts.
- There will be charging points available in every meeting room and hall including the auditorium.
- To assist people who can become overwhelmed by a busy environment, a quiet room will be available.
- An induction loop system, which can be linked to visitors' hearing aids, is operated in selected halls. Free infrared hearing devices are available to borrow at the venue.
- There will be a BSL translator for the main events.
- Assistance and guide dogs are welcome at the ICC.
- Alternative formats (printed, large print, audio, etc.) of the event information can be provided on request.
- The ICC Birmingham security staff are trained in emergency evacuation procedures for those with limited mobility.
- The Together 2022 team of volunteers have an awareness of the inclusion of people with a disability.

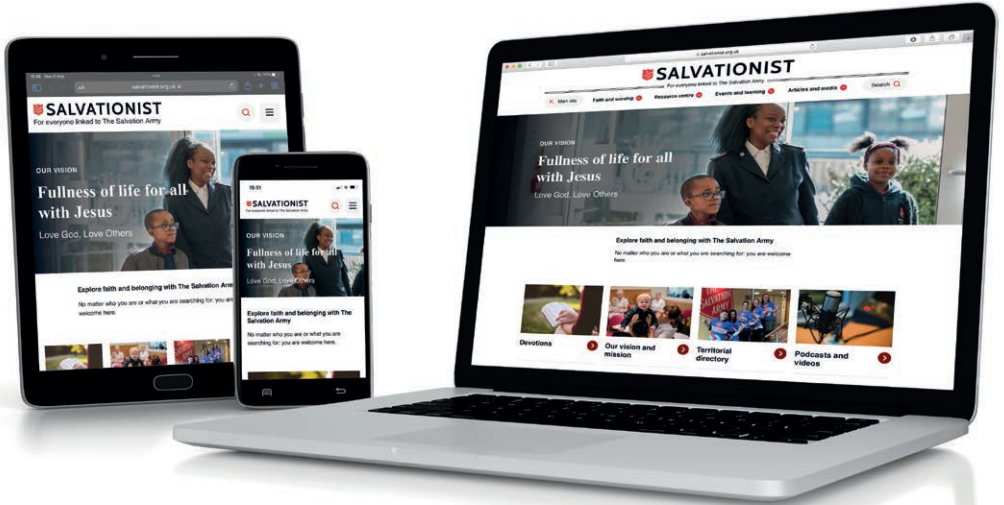
