

# Tilly trained at the Anna Scher Theatre. She has recently been seen in Steven Moffat's *Inside Man* (BBC/Netflix) and in *The Pact*, (BBC).

Other TV includes Dalgliesh, The Chelsea Detective, Maigret, Damned, Vera, Call The Midwife, Tommy – Just Like That, The Infinite World of HG Wells, Eastenders, Teenage Health Freak, Poirot, Inspector Morse, Waking The Dead, New Tricks, Holding On, Will You Love Me Tomorrow, Tipping The Velvet, Blackhearts in Battersea and Hold The Back Page.

Recent films include Matterhorn (released next year,) The Awakening, Thomas Vinterburg's Far From The Madding Crowd, Jake Mann's Karen, and Mike Leigh's Peterloo, Vera Drake and Meantime.

She has just finished filming a new children's film in Ireland to be released next year.

On stage she was in the original productions of *The Pitchfork Disney* by Philip Ridley and *Raspberry* by Tony Marchant. Other theatre credits include *Drag On at the Royal Court, My Sister In This House* at Hampstead, *Banged Up* at the Young Vic and *The Threepenny Opera* at the Bloomsbury Theatre.

On radio she played Ronnie Corbett's daughter in four series of *When The Dog Dies*.

Tilly is also a director and a writer. She directed *A Better Woman* by Simon Mendes de Costa at the Marlowe, and *A Greater Game* at Southwark Playhouse. She adapted Dickens' *Our Mutual Friend* for the stage, and her short film *Domestic Flight* played in festivals across the globe. She was also one of the writers for *Late* on Radio 4, and is currently adapting a children's book for the screen.

#### Jenna is an award winning actress with an extensive range of television and theatre credits to her name.

Her accolades include an Olivier Award for Best Actress in a Musical for her performance as Dot/Marie in *Sunday In The Park With George* at the Wyndhams Theatre in London's West End.

She reprised her role on Broadway at Studio 54, where she won 2008 Theatre World Award for Broadway Debut Performance. She also received a 2008 Tony Award Nomination and 2008 Drama Desk Nomination for the same role and an Olivier Award Nomination for her performance as Mary Flynn in *Merrily We Roll Along at* The Menier Chocolate Factory and The Pinter Theatre. She was also nominated for an Olivier for her performance as Sarah Brown in *Guys And Dolls* at the Piccadilly Theatre starring opposite Ewan McGregor as Sky.

Other recent Theatre credits include: Susan in Woman In Mind

at Chichester Festival Theatre, Carrie in *Steve* at the Seven Dials Playhouse, and Jenna Russell live at Cadogan Hall. Jenna has played leading roles at The National Theatre, Royal Court, RSC and Almeida Theatre as well as many other West End credits including leading roles in *Songs For A New World* (St James Theatre), *Viv and Rose* (Vaudeville Theatre), *Hello Again* (Bridewell Theatre) and *Les Miserables* (Palace Theatre)

Jenna's TV credits include the leading role of Michelle Fowler in EastEnders, Gentlemen Jack, Midsomer Murders, Call the Midwife, The Paradise, Holby City and Doctor Who.

Films include *The Death and Life of John F Donovan* with Natalie Portman and Kit Harington and *Mortdecai* with Ewan McGregor. Jenna also sings the theme tune for BBC cult TV series *Red Dwarf*.



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Dame Sheila Hancock

Sheila's extensive career has ranged from the original West End casts of Sweeney Todd, Annie and Sister Act to being the first Woman Artistic Director of the RSC's tour; from playing Ranyevskaya in The Cherry Orchard at the Royal National Theatre to Celebrity Gogglebox; and from Senna Pod in Carry on Cleo to winning an Olivier Award for her performance as Fraulein Schneider in Cabaret.

On screen Sheila has just completed shooting on the BBC drama, *The Sixth Commandment* and other recent work includes the title role in the feature film *Edie*, ITV's latest series of *Unforgotten*, as well as co-presenting Ch4's *Great Canal Journeys* with Gyles Brandreth. For Sky she played Goody Alsop in *A Discovery of Witches*; Mimi Vincent in three series of *Delicious*; and Gala Dali in *The Dali and the Cooper* (Urban Myths series).

She was awarded Author of the Year for her autobiography *The Two of Us* which she followed with *Just Me;* and then, aged 81, with her

debut novel *Miss Carter's War.* Sheila's latest book *Old Rage* was published by Bloomsbury in June 2022.

She is an active Patron of the Digismart Charity; Trustee of the John Thaw Foundation, and Vice President of St Christopher's Hospice. She was also Chancellor of the University of Portsmouth University 2008-2012 and was awarded a DBE for services to Drama and Charity in 2021.

# Thirteen year old Cormac is the youngest singer ever to be signed to global label, Decca Records.

His debut album *Hear My Voice* charted at #11 (UK Classical Chart) and #3 (Australia's Classical Crossover chart). He was also awarded the coveted Classic FM *Album of the Week*.

With the support of his family and his singing teacher, Daphne Sumbler, Cormac continues recording. Some of his biggest hits to date, have been as an independent artist, racking up a total of over 2 million views on his YouTube channel. Cormac's unique way of taking well - known songs and re-imagining them to more current events, clearly demonstrates just what can be achieved with a little bit of thought and determination.

A finalist in the BBC's Young Chorister of The Year competition (2021), he almost made it to the semi-final of Britain's GotTalent too. In 2022, Cormac was awarded a scholarship to a song writing camp in America. He returned to the recording studio with pianist and producer Dominic Ferris and producer Jon Cohen, whose collective belief in him has made all of this possible. A passionate advocate for young boy singers, Cormac hopes that what he has been able to achieve will inspire others.

Handbells have been rung in the Parish of Broxbourne since the 1850s. From the early 1960s bells were often rung at Christmas by a few ringers, but it wasn't until 1975 that Broxbourne Handbell Ringers formed a permanent team.

There are currently 18 members, ringing 5 octaves of Whitechapel handbells and several octaves of hand chimes. Our team is part of the East Anglia Region of Handbell Ringers of Great Britain (HRGB).

All our members have rung at Regional events, and Broxbourne ringers make up almost a third of the East Anglia Regional Handbell Team of 37 ringers, who give several concerts in the region every year in May and June.

Many of our team have performed at National Rallies and have participated in the International Handbell Symposium which takes place every other year in countries such as Australia, USA, Japan, Korea, Singapore, Hong Kong, Canada and the UK.

We take bookings to perform for women's groups, the local U3A, church groups, care homes and weddings. We have even rung on a float as part of the Lord Mayor's show.

We are continually developing our repertoire to provide a varied selection of classical pieces and hymn tunes, popular tunes, Christmas pieces and works composed specifically for handbells.

A significant number of the band's players are employed by The Salvation Army, others working in a wide range of professions.


All members however, are also active members of their local Salvation Army, many holding leadership positions. The band's purpose is the same as all Salvation Army groups – to bring honour and glory to God.

**Graham Hubbard** 

Graham is an Olivier Award nominated theatre adaptor/director (2022).

He trained at LAMDA (Evelyn Laye Award) and was an actor for fourteen years working extensively in regional/West End theatre, television and film with directors such as Kenneth Branagh, Matthew Warchus, Gregory Doran, John Caird and John Doyle. He then moved into directing and writing.

In the West End Graham was associate director on *Sweeney Todd* (New Ambassadors also at the Eugene O'Neil on Broadway), *Mack and Mabel* (Criterion), *The Sound of Music* (Palladium), *Priscilla, Queen of the Desert* (Palace).

Graham's productions range from Shakespeare, through Coward and Brecht to musical theatre. As artistic director for New Rep Theatre, he was nominated for the Peter Brook Award (2012) for his actor/musician production of *The Caucasian Chalk Circle*. He supports and develops new writing and was nominated for Best Director (Broadway World 2013) for his work on the world premiere of *The Spring Tide*. Graham regularly directs at many of the top drama schools in the UK (CSSD, Arts Ed, LIPA, BSA, LSMT, Guildford Conservatoire.)

For over a decade Graham has enjoyed being artistic director for the Salvation Army's annual charity carol concert at the Royal Albert Hall.

His stage adaptation of Julia Donaldson's children's book *What The Ladybird Heard*, which he also directed, has had two successful West End seasons (Palace and Lyric theatres) and several international tours.

He has written book/lyrics for a new musical adaptation of *The Colonel's Lady* (based on a short story by Somerset Maugham) and has adapted the South African novel, *Buckingham Palace, District Six* for the stage.
