Additional Ideas



Literacy

Write a response to a letter.

Create a chant or rhyme. Every second line could be Heart to God, Hand to man.

Play a game of *Make the Link*. Use Additional Resources sheet 4A. In pairs, challenge the pupils to draw a line between two characters, and write on the line what links them. For example - doughnut girl and hut officer: both fed soldiers. Chaplains and women officer: both visited wounded soldiers. After a set time, mark the sheets together. Share the link ideas, and award one tick for each correct link. If no other pair has the same link written, award two ticks.

History

Research the tomb of the Unknown Soldier - created by Rev David Railton, son of George Scott Railton - a pioneer officer and leader in The Salvation Army.

Visit a Commonwealth War Graves cemetery.

Visit a war memorial - your local Salvation Army hall may have one.

PSHE

Explore the themes covered in the lessons and debate what it may inspire others to do. Discuss what might The Salvation Army might have learned about themselves.

Personal Research

Give pupils time to develop their own avenues of research, as prompted at the end of Lesson Four.
