Jesus had been baptized by John. Now it was time to begin the special work God had given him to do. There were so many people to tell about God's Kingdom that he knew he would need some help.



Read Mark's account in your Bible: Mark 1:14-20

Jesus was walking by the shore of Lake Galilee. He saw two brothers, Simon and Andrew, who were fishing.

Jesus invited the brothers to leave their fishing business and go with him so that they could 'catch' men. They went with him at once.

Then he saw James and John and he called them to go with him too. They went, leaving their father, Zebedee, behind!

Look at the passage in your Mark's Good News Gospel and write in **blue** the words spoken by Jesus and write in **red** the men who went along with Jesus.

Jesus invited, or called, the men to leave their jobs and work with him to 'catch men'. Use a mirror to see what he meant by this.

Jesus meant bringing them into God's Kingdom

Many people still say that they have been 'called by God' to do a special work. We call this a vocation.

Use the KAPAC CODE to discover some jobs for which people have a vocation

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Every job, providing it keeps God's laws, can be a vocation. Have you decided what you want to do when you leave school? Here are some questions to ask yourself:

- Would I enjoy the job?
- Am I suitable?
- Would it be helpful to others?
- Could I stick at it?

As you grow older, talk to your friends, parents and teachers about your ideas for the future. Remember, everything you learn now will help you later.

Most important of all is the vocation to live as a Christian. Jesus calls us to follow him, not just in the work we do, but in the way we live.

AND he calls children to follow his way – the Christian way – too!

What do you think you would do if you met Jesus and he asked you to follow him?

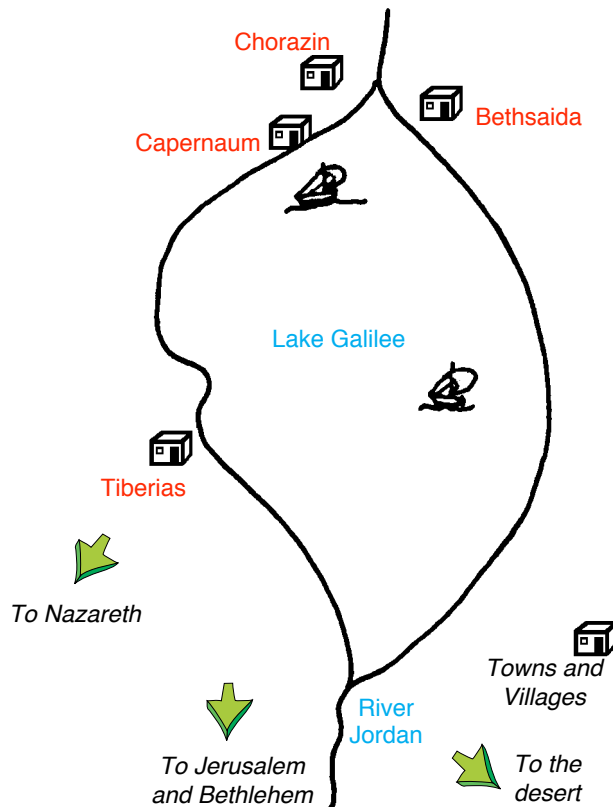
(Jesus doesn't expect children to leave home! There's plenty to do where we are!)
