

A LOVE FOR ALL

Luke 10:25-37 The Good Samaritan

Here are some ideas and activities you could do on your own

SESSION

Bake

Bake some gingerbread men and decorate them to represent all the people in the parable of The Good Samaritan. You could even use a donkey shape!

Investigate

Learn how to do some basic first aid, such as how clean and bandage a small cut or treat a bruise or a burn. Ask an adult to show you what is inside a first-aid kit.



Blow as many bubbles as you can in the garden. As you see all the bubbles float away, think about all the boys, girls, men and women who need to know about God's love and say a prayer for them. Create

Draw around your hands on lots of different types of paper - for example, newspaper, magazines, kitchen paper, card, cereal boxes. Cut out your hand shapes and create a 'circle of hands' picture by sticking them all together. Think about how each hand looks different because of the different type of paper and card you used. This reflects how different all the people in the world are from each other (different culture, race, languages, ages...) but that God loves us all. Sticking them all in a big circle can represent that we are all one!

Draw

Make a people paper chain. On each cut-out shape draw someone you know who you would like to show God's love to in a practical way.

Memorise

'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind; and, love your neighbour as yourself.' (Luke 10:27)

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
