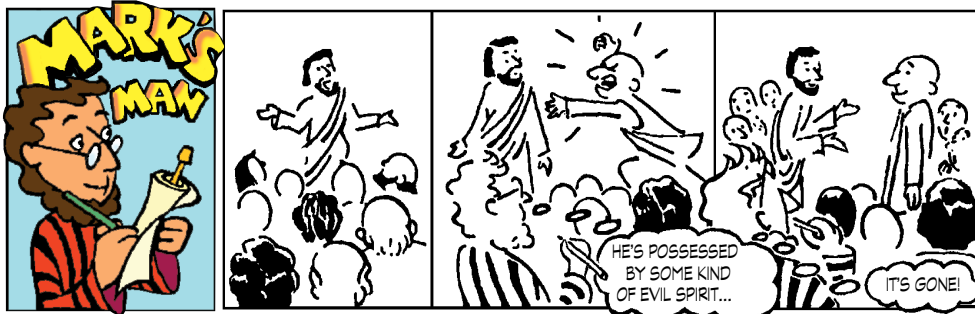

### Sabbath

This is the name of the day which Jewish people keep as holy. They try to go to a place of worship on that day. One of the Ten Commandments reminds them to keep this day special.

When God created the world, the Bible tells us that he rested on the seventh day. It seems wise for us all to do the same! Christians keep Sunday as the special day because the first Easter Day was a Sunday.

### Synagogue

A synagogue is a building for Jews to worship in. The name comes from a Greek word meaning 'an assembly'. When the Jews were forced to leave their country and could not worship at the Temple in Jerusalem, they met together wherever they could. This was the beginning of the synagogue tradition. Now there are synagogues for Jewish worship in many different countries.

### Law

The Jews followed the Law of Moses – the Ten Commandments given to him by God (read them in Exodus 20:1-17), and the many other detailed rules listed in the early part of the Bible.

Have a quick look at the book in the Bible called Leviticus for some examples! Some leaders were experts in the Law and tried to make sure that people kept the rules. These leaders were called Pharisees. Some were good men, but others cared more about the rules than about people.

### Evil Spirit

We cannot see spirits, but we can see the effect they have on people. A person who has God's spirit in his or her life shows this by their good, thoughtful and kind actions.

Sadly, the evil spirit is also powerful. We call him Satan, or The Devil. A person who allows the evil spirit to control his or her life behaves selfishly, thoughtlessly or even violently. However, there is no evil power or person who is stronger than God.

People used to think that sickness (especially mental illness involving violent actions) was caused by evil spirits. They blamed sick people for letting this to happen to them. Today, we understand illnesses much better and mostly treat sick people kindly. Jesus sets a perfect pattern to follow in the way he treated the man in the story.

### Province of Galilee

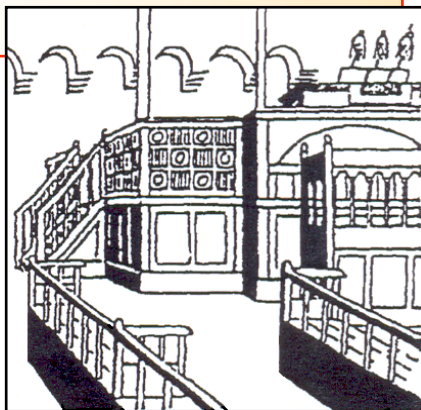
