MONDAY 9 AUGUST

◯ WELCOME TO WALES (CROESO I GYMRU)

TUESDAY 17 AUGUST

OPRAYING FOR MYSELF

Draw out the letters of your name and pray on something that each letter prompts. It could be a subject or a need that begins with that letter, or it could be a theme that the letter suggests. These prayers may start to be about your relationship with God, but could turn into prayers about other people in your life. When we start praying about ourselves it often becomes about someone else intertwined, just as in the prayer plait from yesterday. Holding the prayer plait as you pray may help.

Well, Lord, the week has really started! I'm back into the routine of things – daily chores, at home, at work, at school. It's sometimes hard to see you in all of this, so I ask that you make your presence known to me. A kind word or a loving act, the beauty of the world around, or peace through the people I meet – all these are from you, I know. Help me to be aware of them, and to find you in them. In Jesus' name. Amen.

WEDNESDAY 18 AUGUST

PRAYING FOR OTHERS (LOCALLY)

There may be situations around you that give you a sense of uncertainty – things beyond your control or may seem beyond your help. Prayer is always a positive action to take. Start with praying for others in your local community. Take a local newspaper and circle or highlight stories that catch your eye. As you read the article, think about those affected and pray into the situation. If you are doing this online simply highlight the article.

Dear Lord, we often feel helpless when we read about things on our doorstep which affect so many and yet which we seem unable to help with. Suffering seems to be so close and rampant. However, Lord, I thank you for those good news stories – people bringing hope, giving their time and helping those in need. Be with those who are celebrating as well as those who are suffering. Give me guidance on how to help others in my community and allow people to see you through all that I do. Amen.

THURSDAY 19 AUGUST

> PRAYING FOR FAMILY

Take a piece of card and pens and draw a tree trunk. Write the word GOD in the centre of it. Using different colours, draw a branch

growing off the trunk and then write the name of a member of your family at the end of the branch. As you write the name pray for that person and any concerns that you may have for them, or simply say their name and bring them before God in prayer.

Dear Lord, today I am reminded that you are indeed the vine and we are the branches and that my help comes directly from you. Lord, be the centre of my family, be in our comings and our goings and our everyday lives. When times get busy fill us and energise us; we cannot do this in our own strength. Lord, you know my concerns and my love for those that I hold dear. Be with them and keep them safe from harm. Amen.

FRIDAY 20 AUGUST

PRAYING FOR THE OTHERS (THE WORLD)

Have a national newspaper in front of you or online, and as you come across stories that catch your eye either circle with a pen or use the highlighter on the screen. Stop and read the article and then pray into the situation. Do this for three different articles from three different areas.

God, the world often seems such a big place and I seem so small and insignificant to its events. But God, I know that I have a role to play and how I live my life can directly affect the world that I live in. Help me to live a responsible life – an informed and just life in the decisions that will impact others. Please give wisdom and discernment to all who make decisions on the global stage and make each voice heard in the search for peace for all in the world in which we live. Amen.

SATURDAY 21 AUGUST

OBJUING PRAISE TO GOD

Have you ever tried a creative prayer walk? As you walk (either a short walk or just around your garden), take in the beauty of the world God has made. Stop and touch things that appeal to you. Thank God for the world in which we live and the bounty of creation that is ours. Find something that no longer has any life (perhaps a dead leaf), hold it and think about God's act of giving his own son to die for us. Now find something living, hold it or look at it and thank God for the assurance of new life, for Jesus' resurrection and the very real promise of eternal life for all.

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Dear Heavenly Father, I want to thank you for the promise of new life and the evidence of it around me everywhere I look. You have created a world so perfect and beautiful, and I am sorry for the times when I have not appreciated or respected it. Lord, I just want to thank you for the gift of your son to me and that through his death I may receive eternal life. Amen.

E SUNDAY 22 AUGUST

As the week draws to a close, return to the wool plait and hold it between your fingers. Place your thumb on the first section where the wool strands cross over. Think about our first topic of prayer which was 'myself'. After a while lower the thumb to the next section and think about the second topic, 'others locally'. Continue to do this moving through the sections and thinking of family, others in the world, God's creation and promise of new life.

Dear Lord, as I come to the end of my week of creative prayer, I bring all that has been on my heart and lay it at your feet. Lord, I do this knowing that you are indeed an awesome God and nothing is too big for you. I bring myself, my family, others whether near or far. WEDNESDAY 1 SEPTEMBER

Read Leviticus 19:9-10: What do these two verses say to you about caring for the vulnerable? Spend some time in prayer asking God to reveal to you those in need in your community. If you can, do some research on what community or support services are available in your area.

We pray for our safe houses in the UK. May they be places of refuge to those who have survived and are now awaiting more support. FRIDAY 22 OCTOBER - ISAIAH 58:10-11

We pray for the Anti-Trafficking and Modern Slavery Unit and the departments within it. We pray that you will guide each individual to understand that they are a part of your plan and call for freedom for the enslaved in our country. May we be courageous in our dreaming and believing in a slave-free world. Amen.

☑ SATURDAY 23 OCTOBER - LUKE 19:1-10

We pray for the enslavers and traffickers. May they encounter Jesus in the same way that Zacchaeus did and so change their ways. Help us to put aside our own prejudices and pray that they too would seek out Jesus and the power of his love and redemption in their lives. Amen.

INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOCUS

& HAYLEY STILL (UK ENGAGEMENT CO-ORDINATOR)

MONDAY 25 OCTOBER - INTRODUCTION

The Salvation Army International Development UK (SAID UK) provides financial and technical support to more than 40 projects around the world. As we focus on a different area of work each day this week, pray for the project community members who are working to overcome the injustices they are experiencing and for The Salvation Army officers, employees and volunteers who walk alongside with love and compassion as they give practical and emotional support.

TUESDAY 26 OCTOBER - ANTI-TRAFFICKING

In Ukraine, young people leaving government care with limited skills and resources are vulnerable to human traffickers. The Salvation Army provides skills training and guidance, so they are less vulnerable and have the confidence to provide for themselves. Pray that these young people know that they are loved and recognise their inherent worth as children of God

WEDNESDAY 27 OCTOBER - CLEAN WATER

In Malawi, the provision of clean water and sanitation facilities means that community members are no longer vulnerable to waterborne diseases. It means women can take up incomegenerating activities rather than spending hours collecting water, and it means girls no longer miss school due to the lack of a private place to use the toilet. Pray for the hope and possibilities that access to clean water provides.

THURSDAY 28 OCTOBER - EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Whilst the UK Territory provides financial support to short-term emergency response projects, the local Salvation Army is a constant in the country where the project takes place. It is not only there for the emergency, but also part of the community long term. Pray for The Salvation Army as it provides ongoing practical, spiritual and relational support, and thank God that as one, global Army we are able to support our brothers and sisters around the world in times of crisis.

FRIDAY 29 OCTOBER - FOOD SECURITY

In Burkina Faso, 100 small-scale farmers are being trained in new techniques so they can increase their crop yields, feed their families and sell surplus at the market. Pray for them as they adapt to a new way of approaching familiar work, and as they go on to train others in their communities.

SATURDAY 30 OCTOBER - GENDER JUSTICE

In Argentina, women who have experienced domestic violence support one another through group therapy. Pray for those who have already begun their journey of healing and for the women whose pain remains unknown, that they will find safety from their abusers.

SUNDAY 31 OCTOBER - INCOME GENERATION

In Kenya The Salvation Army facilitates community savings and loans groups. Members regularly contribute small amounts of money to build up a communal fund. They can then each take loans from this shared pot to start or expand their business or pay for unexpected costs. In a setting where individual competition and conflict could so easily prosper, praise God that community is flourishing.

MONDAY 1 NOVEMBER - GENESIS 1:31 (NLT)

'Then God looked over all he had made, and he saw that it was very good!'

At the start of this week let us just take a moment to pause and gaze on all that God has created. God saw that it was good – praise him for the wonder of his creation.

TUESDAY 2 NOVEMBER - 1 KINGS 8:56 (NLT)

'My heart is confident in you, O God; no wonder I can sing your praises with all my heart!'

God is faithful to us and will not let us down. We can therefore be confident in God. It is because of that confidence that today we can praise him, even if there are times when it is hard.

FRIDAY 5 NOVEMBER - ISAIAH 12:5 (NLT)

'Sing to the Lord, for he has done wonderful things. Make known his praise around the world.'

As we focus in these days on our praises to God, let us celebrate by making it known in the places where God leads us. The wonderful things that God has done are too great to keep quiet about. There is power in the sharing of our praises to God.

'The crowd was amazed! Those who hadn't been able to speak were talking, the crippled were made well, the lame were walking, and the blind could see again! And they praised the God of Israel.'

A GOSPEL FRAMEWORK

A MAJOR NOEL WRIGHT (TERRITORIAL EVANGELIST)

MONDAY 15 NOVEMBER - READ 1 CORINTHIANS 15: 1-11

Contained within these verses Paul presents a 'gospel framework' which, when applied to our daily living, can keep us true to the gospel in how we both experience and express it. The gospel is primarily God's good news about his Son, Jesus is the gospel and the gospel is Jesus. Read vv3-5 again several times and note Paul's focus on Christ. Reflect for a few moments on who Jesus is and pray that you will represent him well in all you say and do today.

TUESDAY 16 NOVEMBER - READ 1 CORINTHIANS 15: 1-11

Note Paul's use of the phrase 'according to the Scriptures' (v4). The validity of the gospel is rooted in the revelation of Scripture. The Jesus who is central to the good news is the Jesus who is at the heart of the Bible. The early Church witnessed to the Christ who was the fulfilment of biblical prophecy, their Jesus was the Jesus of Scripture – so must ours be. Reflect on a Bible verse that speaks about Jesus, praying that the Spirit of illumination guides you into a fresh understanding of your Saviour.

™ WEDNESDAY 17 NOVEMBER - READ 1 CORINTHIANS 15: 1-11

In his 'gospel framework' Paul lists certain key events and he does so because they happened. The Christian faith is anchored within historical happenings (see Luke 1:1-4). The gospel isn't hearsay or rumour, it's not philosophy or fantasy nor is it simply sound advice. The good news is divine truth revealed through things that took

place; they happened and they have a timeless relevance. Reflect on the key events listed by Paul and think through something of their significance for you today. In your prayers thank God for the revelation he graciously gives through his word.

➡ THURSDAY 18 NOVEMBER - READ 1 CORINTHIANS 15: 1-11

'For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance' (v3). Someone, somewhere, had given these foundational gospel truths to Paul and he had shared them with the people in Corinth because they were 'of first importance'. They still are! These truths are nonnegotiable and remain central to the gospel. Reflect on the centrality of Christ, his cross and resurrection, praying that the Spirit of truth will help you in living true to these foundational truths.

FRIDAY 19 NOVEMBER - READ 1 CORINTHIANS 15: 1-11

The gospel is universal in its message, good news for all that requires a personal response. Read v1 noting that the believers in Corinth had chosen for themselves to believe the gospel, a past response that was still a present life-impacting reality for each of them. Might the question asked of himself by Pilate be life's most important: 'What shall I do, then, with Jesus who is called the Messiah?" (Matthew 27:22). Reflect on those people who have helped you in your personal journey of faith, praying that God will use you to play your part in others coming to know Christ for themselves.

☑ SATURDAY 20 NOVEMBER - READ 1 CORINTHIANS 15: 1-11

In the closing verses Paul shares something of his own experience of the transforming impact of the gospel. Jesus is still in the business of changing lives: 'he can save fully and completely those who approach God through him' (Hebrews 7:25 *JBP*). There is no life beyond Christ's power to transform. This remains the good news of the gospel of transformation. Reflect on your experience of God's transforming grace, thanking God as you do. Ask God to give you opportunities to share your story with others.

SUNDAY 21 NOVEMBER - BOUNDLESS SALVATION

Catherine Booth once said this about salvation: 'It is not a scheme

of salvation merely – it is a scheme of restoration. God proposes to restore me – brain, heart, soul, spirit, body, every fibre of my nature – to restore me perfectly, to conform me wholly to the image of his Son.'

Our God, Father, Son and Spirit, we give thanks for the boundless salvation that you have provided for all people. We pray for our officers, that they may have a deeper understanding of its immensity, that it may enrich their lives and those to whom they minister. Amen.

WEDNESDAY 24 NOVEMBER - THE TOLL OF MINISTRY

From Hebrews 12:1,3 The Passion Translation:

'We must let go of every wound that has pierced us... Then we will be able to run life's marathon race with passion and determination.

Consider carefully how Jesus faced intense opposition... so that you won't become worn down and cave in under life's pressures.'

Dear Lord, you understand how ministry can be mentally, physically and spiritually draining. We pray that our officers may be able to let go of hurts, that wounds will be healed and that they may be strengthened to withstand the pressures of life in their ministry. Amen.

THURSDAY 25 NOVEMBER - WELLBEING OF UK OFFICERS SERVING OVERSEAS.

'Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?... If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast' (Psalms 139:7,9,10).

Officers serving in places outside of their own territories face added challenges as they minister in unfamiliar places that lie outside their comfort zones.
