SHOWING LOVE TO THE WORLD

James 2:14-17 Faith and Good Works

Each child will need:

➔ Pens/pencils and paper

You will need:

➔ PowerPoint slide with words from James 2:14-17 – see Tell It section

As Christians, everything we do is because God loves us and we love God. We can strengthen our faith in Jesus by reading our Bible, and by praying and spending time with other people who love Jesus too. Jesus said that love is the most important thing – to love God, to love others and to love ourselves (Matthew 22:36-40).

Over the past few *Explore It* sessions we have been thinking about creation and the fact that God loves everything he has made. When we think about showing love to others, that doesn't only mean people, it can mean all living things.

Start It

Play a game based on 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 to get the group thinking about how we can show love to our world.

Screen share: 'Love is' Picker Wheel https://pickerwheel.com/pw?id=8NgTZ

Click the 'spin' button to randomly select a 'Love is/does' statement from the Bible for each person in the group, one by one. Whatever it lands on, ask them to share an example of how we can show love in that way. Select 'Hide choice' after each spin to make sure you get to see all of the responses.

Sing It

Jesus is the best example of love we have. In the way he lived his life on Earth, he showed us how to love people. We can read in the Bible about lots of times where Jesus:

- showed love to people that no one else was kind to (Matthew 8:1-4)
- ➔ fed people who were hungry (Matthew 14:13-21)
- forgave people who did wrong (Luke 19:1-10)
- spoke up when he saw unfair things happening (Matthew 21:12-13)

If we choose to follow Jesus in our everyday lives, his love and light can be seen in us. The way we act and treat other people will be an example to others about what it means to be a follower of Jesus, to be a Christian.

Tell If

Read James 2:14-17 – invite a few children to 'act out' the paraphrase:

Person 1: My friends, if someone says they have faith, but do nothing, their faith is worth nothing. Can faith like that save them? Imagine if a friend came to you and said:

Person 2: Please help me, I need clothes and food.

Person 1: But you just said:

Person 3: God be with you! I hope you stay warm and get plenty to eat.

Person 1: Is that enough? If you say this, but do not give that person the things they need, your words are worth nothing. It is the same with faith. If faith does nothing, then that faith is dead, because it is alone.

- **Say:** It is important to show our love to God and develop our faith. We can do this by:
- reading our Bible, so we can learn more about him and how he wants to live our lives,
- praying, so we can have a relationship with God and talk to him about all of the things we care about, are happy about or are worried about, and
- spending time in community with others, so we can share God's love with them and make the world better for everyone who lives in it.
- Say: The verses in James show us that it is not enough only to think about the justice issues, we also need to act.

Action It

The Great Big Green Week is taking place from 18-26 September and is a brilliant opportunity to connect with others in your local community. It may be that there are already a lot of activities that you can take part in, or perhaps there are others who want to take collective action but are not sure where to start.

Could your group work together during The Great Big Green Week to raise awareness about the importance of caring for creation, and take action to address the climate crisis?

There are already hundreds of events planned as part of The Great Big Green Week such as art events, family fun days, nature walks, webinars and local theatre shows.

There are also lots of things we can do as individuals and as a church to care for creation such as:

- Find out who your MP is and write to them to ask what they are doing to address climate change
- Calculate your own or your family's carbon footprint climatestewards.org/offset
- Speak to your corps leader about your group taking part in or even leading a Sunday meeting one day soon – consider making it a 'Climate Sunday'
- Speak to your corps leaders about signing up as an Eco Church
