ONLINE YOUTH GROUP Arts Award-winning project.

A youth mentoring project combining game design, animation, comic book creation and digital illustration has been supporting young people during lockdown. The virtual centre gives isolated teens a chance to learn new

skills plus a safe space to discuss troubling topics.
