We are a worldwide organisation We are at work in 131 countries

Homelessness support:

- 83 Lifehouses
- 3,200 places every night
- specialised centres for young people and families



Our **Lifehouses** help people who are experiencing **homelessness** to rebuild their lives with training and support.

The **Red Shield van** is used during **emergencies**. It provides food and drink to emergency workers and people in need.





Our **charity shops** sell affordable clothes and other goods. This helps to raise money for **community projects**.

We help people out of poverty through training and support.
We campaign to make changes – to make things fair.





We run many projects around the world, for **clean water**, improved **farming** techniques, **health** and **education**.
