Climate change exacerbates existing problems such as poverty, hunger, and lack of access to clean water. Through its international projects, The Salvation Army is working alongside communities to increase their resilience to climate change.

In Kenya, The Salvation Army has supported the construction of sand-dams which not only improve access to clean water, but through local, climate-smart agriculture help to improve nutrition despite the impacts of climate change. Tree planting and environmental conservation are also incorporated into the project to boost the local habitat and aid the prevention of land degradation.

In Zimbabwe, The Salvation Army is training small-scale farmers in simple and sustainable farming techniques to help them make the best use of their land, improve their resilience to climate change and increase their crop yields. In Burkina Faso, farmers are working together to improve the health of their soil by creating organic liquid fertiliser. Through this project, both community cohesion and resilience is being built.
