SESSION ONE: PANCAKE DAY AND LENT



BIBLE STORY

Matthew 4:1-4 Jesus in the desert

Note

Talk about how Pancake Day in the UK is also known as Shrove Tuesday and it is traditionally a day of fun and feasting before the 40 days of Lent start on Ash Wednesday.

There are 40 days in Lent to prepare for Easter because Jesus went to the desert for 40 days to prepare for his ministry.

Lent is a time of preparation for celebrating Easter, just as Advent helps us prepare to celebrate Christmas.

You can also talk about the food we eat at special times and why we eat pancakes.

Luke 15:1-7



BIBLE STORY

Luke 4: 38-39

Ask the children about their Mum and everything they do for them. Talk about all the women who love and help them – Mum, Grandma, Auntie, Godmother etc, and how special they are.

There are a number of stories about good mothers in the Bible. For example, you could also use:

If possible, prepare a small take-home gift for all the women present in the group and any single dads.

SONG SUGGESTIONS

BIBLE STORY

Genesis 8:22

'As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease.'

Note

There is usually lots of rain in springtime! Talk about why we need it to rain and about the fun we can have playing in the rain.

Tell the story of Noah and how it rained for 40 days and nights, but that God has promised never to flood the whole world again.



CRAFT IDEAS

- Make a Hobby Donkey by giving each child two donkey head shapes to decorate. Ensure the shapes face different ways. Add wool fringing for a mane. Sandwich the end of a garden cane between the two heads and hold in place with parcel tape.

Although the story of Good Friday is difficult for small children to understand, it is important that we talk about both the death and resurrection of Jesus as part of the Easter Story.

EASTER STORY

Bring out hollow coloured Easter eggs with the items in brackets inside and as you open them tell the Easter story.

GREEN (donkey) – Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey and everyone shouted and cheered for him. We celebrate this on Palm Sunday.

PINK (bread) – On Thursday, Jesus had a very special meal with his friends.

ORANGE (coins) – Jesus' friend Judas told the guards where to find Jesus to capture him for 30 pieces of silver.

BLUE (nails) - On Friday some men who didn't like Jesus took him away to die on a cross.

YELLOW (white handkerchief) – On Saturday some of Jesus' friends wrapped Jesus' body in a white sheet and put it into a special cave.

GOLDEN (empty!) - But on Sunday, Jesus was alive! It was the first Easter Day!

PURPLE (chocolate eggs) – They remind us that Jesus died and rose again for us.
