Why have Scouting and Guiding at your corps?









Scouting and Guiding provides a readypackaged known and trusted outreach programme for children and young people in your community.



#### What is Scouting and Guiding?

- Scouting and Guiding are International movements, aiming to provide young people with opportunities to develop socially, morally and spiritually.
- The supported programme provides young people with exciting and challenging opportunities.
- The programme is varied, offering intellectual, physical and stimulating activities.

#### Is it relevant to society?


- Over 460,000 young people and over 100,000 adult volunteers are involved in Scouting in the UK.
- Over 6,000,000 girls and women are involved in Guiding in the UK.
- One in three 8 year old girls are Brownies.
- There are 50,000 girls on waiting lists to join Guiding and 60,000 waiting to join Scouting, due to a lack of adult leaders and facilities\*.

#### Is it relevant to my local community?

- Scouting and Guiding can open doors into the community by linking families into your corps programme.
- A recent YouGov poll shows that 73% of the public says they trusted the Scout Association and that 84% of the public believe that Scouts provides skills useful in later life.
- Scouting and Guiding will already be taking place in your town. Existing support through local leadership can help with strengthening and starting new groups.

#### What do Scout and Guide Groups expect from their corps?

- All Scout and Guide groups should be accepted as part of the corps in every sense and encouraged to participate.
- It is a two-way relationship, so ideally corps members and the Corps Officer (as Chaplain), should also be invited to participate in group meetings so that the young people have a link with the corps family.
- The Salvation Army believes that all young people are valued by God and have a part to play in God's Kingdom. The Corps Officer in their role as Chaplain can endorse this.
