TOGETHER, WE CAN SUPPORT SURVIVORS

- Pray for survivors' physical and emotional healing, for restoration and strength to overcome the trauma they have experienced.
- Pray that survivors have access to the resources essential for their recovery, such as counselling and medical care.
- Pray for better income-generation opportunities at home so the drive to leave is lessened.
- Pray for a renewed sense of self-worth and identity for survivors.
- Pray for connected, supportive and understanding communities that will offer survivors love, empathy, and a safe space for healing.

- Pray for legal protection for survivors, that they may find justice and that their rights will be upheld.
