

Moses Series Summary

Week 30 - wb 21/07/25

Session One – Moses

Over the next ten weeks we will explore the life of Moses and why he is such an important part of God's story. Today's Bassline session will give us an overview of the life and experiences of Moses. We'll explore how his character changed and developed at different times in his life and use symbols from his story as our inspiration for prayer.

Week 31 - wb 28/07/25

Session Two – Lost (Exodus 1 and 2)

In today's session we begin our journey through the life of Moses. We'll discover a small baby boy benefiting from the bravery of a big sister. We'll see a fall from royal privilege to isolating exile, and we'll discover what it means to live in spiritual wilderness. Moses was lost, but God had a plan. Today, we will discover the beginning of that plan and take a moment to explore what we can do in times of Spiritual wilderness.

Week 32 - wb 04/08/25

Session Three – God's Calls Moses (Exodus 3 and 4)

Moses was settled in the wilderness. For many years he tended his father-in-law's sheep and adapted to life outside the privileges of the royal palace. God had other plans. In today's Bassline we'll consider the many excuses Moses gave when God called him to liberate the Israelites from the Egyptians. We'll think about whether we use those excuses and consider how Scripture can shift our focus from our perceived weakness to God's almighty power.

Week 33 - wb 11/08/25

Session Four – The One True God (Exodus 5 to 11)

God called Moses to lead the Israelites from captivity to freedom. After making numerous excuses, Moses finally responded to God's call. In today's Bassline we will witness the power struggle between Pharaoh and the many gods of Egypt, and Yahweh, the one true God. Through a series of plagues, the power of the Egyptian gods was systematically dismantled and the Israelites finally began their pathway to freedom.

Week 34 - wb 18/08/25

Session Five – When God Does Amazing Things (Exodus 11 to 15)

Today's Bassline is centred around the liberation of the Israelites from the oppression of the Egyptians. Throughout Exodus 11 to 15 God does amazing things for his people – but there are challenging parts to navigate in this story. Alongside the demonstrations of God's miraculous power, we'll see destruction and violence. How do we sit with these contradictory aspects of God's character? We'll also consider how we can take time to praise God for the amazing things he has done, and continues to do, in our lives.

Week 35 – wb 25/08/25**Session Six – When We Forget That God Does Amazing Things (Exodus 16)**

This week's Bassline is full of moaning, grumbling and complaining. Despite the amazing things God had done for the Israelites, they still found plenty to complain about. God provided for their every need, but it was never enough. What can we learn from their story? How can we switch our focus from everything we lack to everything God has given us?

Week 36 – wb 01/09/25**Session Seven – The Trusted Mentor (Exodus 2:15-22 & Exodus 18:1-27)**

We all need wise people in our lives who can give us guidance and support. Moses was no different, and this week we'll explore his relationship with his trusted mentor, Jethro. As we think about the importance of these kinds of relationships, the young people will have the opportunity to consider whether they would like a spiritual mentor and how that could potentially work in your corps setting. They can also share their experiences of having a trusted mentor to support them on their spiritual journey.

Week 37 – wb 08/09/25**Session Eight – Mountain-Top Moments (Exodus 19:16-25; 33:7-11; Deuteronomy 34:10-12)**

Mountains have always played a special part in sacred moments throughout Scripture. In today's Bassline we will spend time with Moses at Mount Sinai. We'll witness as Moses bravely stood before God to enable a deeper connection with his people.

Week 38 – wb 15/09/25**Session Nine – A Life of Obedience (Exodus 20 to 32)**

Today's Bassline explores a set of commandments whose influence prevails in the laws of our land today. God gave his people a set of guidelines to live in harmony with him and with others. The people thought they knew better! Today's Bassline explores the Ten Commandments, considers their relevance today and gives the young people opportunity to think about what it means to live a life of obedience to God.

Week 39 – wb 22/09/25**Session Ten – So Much For My Happy Ending! (Selected Scriptures)**

The final session of this series pulls together the whole story of Moses. We'll discover what happened in the final years of his life and see if he got his happy ending.
