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Safeguarding for Everyone FAQs

What is the Safeguarding for Everyone video?

The Safeguarding for Everyone video is a new safeguarding awareness video to be shown to corps congregations and weekday groups. It replaces the Safe & Sound for Everyone and Safeguarding Adults videos.

Our corps has recently shown Safe & Sound for Everyone. Do we have to watch the new video?

We are encouraging all corps settings to show the new video at a time most suitable to them but would encourage you to do so within the next few months if possible. The new video is much shorter than Safe & Sound for Everyone and introduces new information such as the 4Rs that will support your local efforts to safeguard your programmes well.

Is the new video only for Sunday congregations and children/youth workers?

No. The new video is intended to be shown in as many corps programmes as possible. As the title suggests, it is for everyone, and we encourage you to show it to as many people attending your activities as possible. For example, if you have the appropriate technology, you may choose to have the video with subtitles playing in the background in communal areas of your building. However, those working with children and adults will need to watch the video, including new volunteers and staff.

So, is this video the new safeguarding training?

No. The new video is designed to raise awareness and give a positive message around safeguarding so everyone working in our corps settings should watch it as part of their induction. New material is being produced and will be available shortly. We will let you know when it is ready. [See below](#) for more information.

Do I have to show the Safeguarding Prayer video?

The prayer video may not be suitable for every setting in which you show Safeguarding for Everyone. It is for you to decide where and when this is most appropriate.

Do I have to use the PowerPoint presentation slides?

The slides have been created to frame the videos, especially when showing them to a congregation. There is also slide where you can add the names of your Safeguarding and Deputy Safeguarding Lead for people to record on their 4Rs card.

What is the 4Rs card for?

The 4Rs card is intended to be an aide memoir for your congregation and group members. It also provides them with a space to record the names of your Safeguarding and Deputy Safeguarding Lead and includes the main TSA website address for more safeguarding information.

You haven't sent me enough cards, where can I get more?

Please contact your DHQ if you require more cards.

Why have you produced different versions of the new Safeguarding poster?

We wanted to emphasise the message that we all have a part to play when it comes to safeguarding and so we selected images of some of the people featured in the video to represent this on the posters. You can display the posters that are most relevant to your setting. At least one poster should be displayed in a prominent place, e.g. entrance foyer. Having more than one poster allows you to display a poster in other parts of your building.

Why is the new poster a different size?

The old poster was not a standard size and some corps struggled to find a suitable place to display it. The new posters are A2 and are virtually the same width as the white plastic one they replace. We hope the smaller, standard size will help with placement in a prominent area.

What is the 4Rs poster for?

The 4Rs poster is a reminder to people to Recognise, Respond, Record and Report anything that might make them feel uncomfortable or unsafe. You can decide where the most suitable place for this is in your building.

Where do I find the information for the Safeguarding Contacts poster and where should I display it?

The information required for this poster should already be on your We Want To Hear leaflets, so it should just be a case of copying this over, although it is also a good opportunity to check the information is correct. If you are unsure about what to include, please contact safeguarding@salvationarmy.org.uk or your DHQ as appropriate.

We suggest that this poster is displayed alongside the main safeguarding poster or 4Rs poster in a prominent public place.

Where can I get more copies of the posters?

Please contact your DHQ if you require more copies of the main Safeguarding poster and the 4Rs poster.

What do I do with my old poster(s)?

Please replace your old poster (including any old 'Safe & Sound purple posters') with one of the new ones. The old poster should be disposed of.

Can my old poster be recycled?

Unfortunately, we don't know if the plastic used in the old poster is recyclable. Please contact your local authority who may accept different types of plastic at public recycling centres. The new posters have been printed on paper so that they can be recycled when replaced.

What happens to all the leaflets?

The following leaflets should be removed from public areas and disposed of:

- We Want To Hear
- Kids Own
- Youth Information
- Information for Parents and Carers
- Safe & Sound Summary Policy
- Safeguarding Adults Summary Policy

The remaining Safeguarding Adults leaflets can continue to be used to provide helpful information until further notice.

What do I do with the Safe & Sound 'purple' box and its contents?

These should be disposed of and recycled wherever possible.

Where can I find safeguarding guidance in future?

All resources will be available online on either OurHub, Salvationist or Net Consent, and as new resources are released, we will let you know where they can be found. If you are struggling to find a specific resource or the information you require, please contact us or your Divisional Safeguarding Officer.

Why do I have to look in multiple places for the information I require?

Each of the Army's websites is aimed at a different audience. Traditionally most of our material has only been available on OurHub, but we realise that not everyone who needs it has access, so we will be making more resources available on Salvationist in the coming months.

What's happening with safeguarding training?

Safe & Sound for Everyone and Safeguarding Adults training will be replaced by a series of Safeguarding Topic Talk videos that will cover a range of subjects for all

volunteers and staff working with children and/or adults. More information will be available shortly.

Safeguarding Leaders training will become Safeguarding for Leaders and will also combine children and adult safeguarding. This will be shorter in length than the existing training and will use different learning formats. More information will be available shortly.

If you need to provide training to somebody before the new resources are available, please contact the Safeguarding Department for advice.

How will I know when new resources are available?

We will use the Bulletin, and our pages on OurHub and Salvationist to announce new resources.
