Here, at the start of my officership, I wait in excitement to see what this next season holds, and how I can continue to join in with God as I do his work.

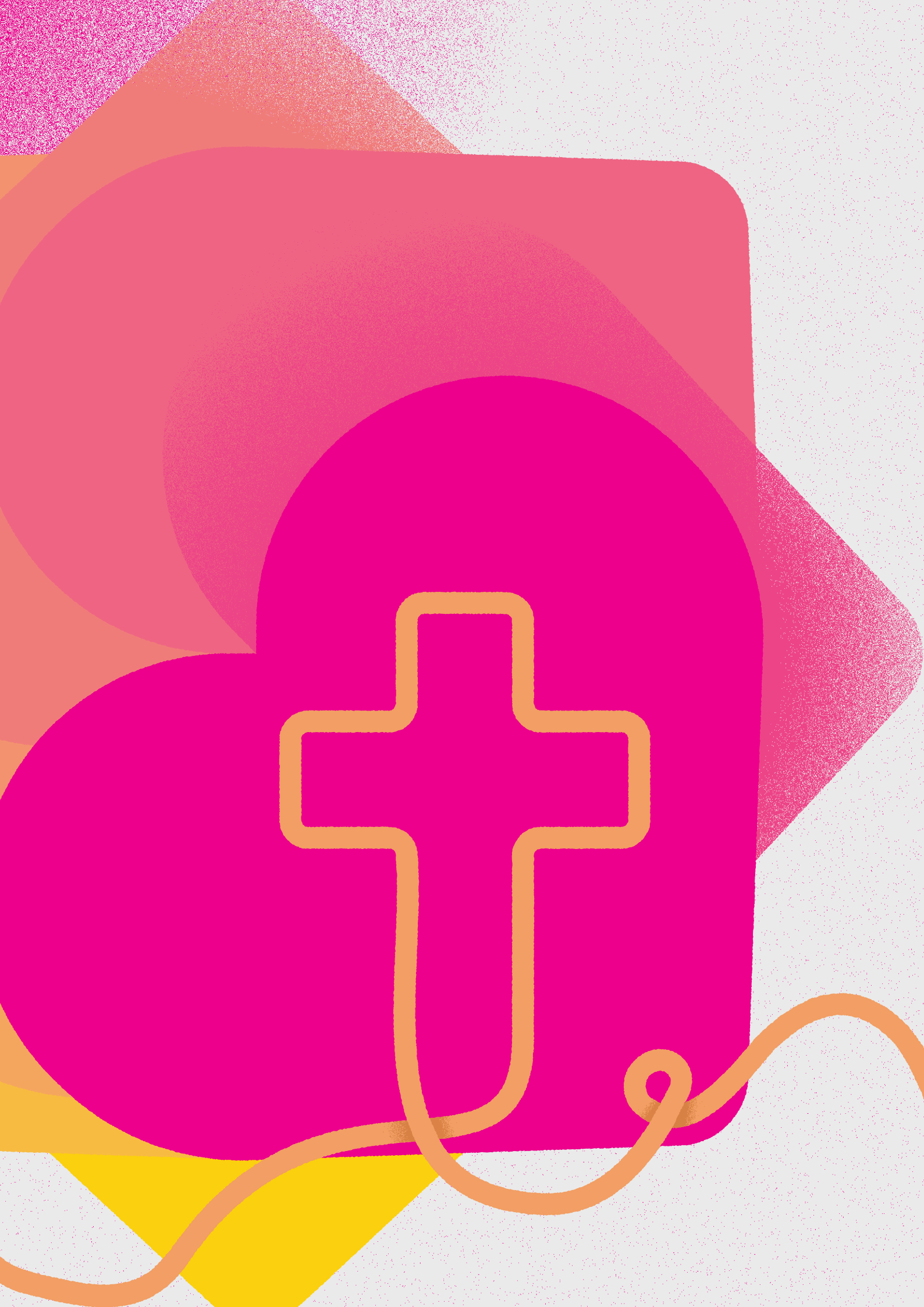

Making Sense of What's Happening Today

You may hear a few terms that are unfamiliar to you during today's commissioning meeting which have an important meaning in The Salvation Army. Here is a short explanation of some of these to help you understand what is happening.



Officer Training

Following an application process which includes development plans and assessments, formal training for officership consists of either residential learning at William Booth College or Distance Learning. Training involves practical and academic studies both on campus and on placement at different Salvation Army settings.

Following commissioning, training continues with five years of the Into Officership programme and, of course, is followed by a lifetime of learning and development.



Salute

The Salvation Army salute, which is the raising of the right hand with the index finger pointing upwards, symbolically recognises that everything we do is because of who God is and what God has done for us.



Declaration of Faith

The Declaration of Faith is the recital of the eleven Doctrines - key beliefs and teachings - of The Salvation Army.

The Doctrines explore and define (as best we can) our understanding of God, humanity and Christian life. They are unique to The Salvation Army, but they share a common emphasis with other Christian traditions. They are the foundation of faith, providing a benchmark which helps Salvationists to live out their faith.



The Covenant

One definition of a covenant is a solemn and sacred agreement or mutual promise between two or more parties.

A few days prior to the ordination and commissioning, in a very special service at William Booth College, each cadet signs a covenant - a promise to love and serve God, and to faithfully fulfil the duties and responsibilities of an officer in The Salvation Army.



Ordination and Commissioning

Each cadet will affirm their faith and declare their intention to be loyal to the truths of Scripture as they are ordained as ministers and commissioned to serve as Salvation Army officers.



Appointing

Declaration of Faith

In the name of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, and in the presence of the officers, soldiers, adherents and friends of The Salvation Army here assembled, we declare that:

We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and that they only constitute the Divine rule of Christian faith and practice.

We believe that there is only one God, who is infinitely perfect, the Creator, Preserver, and Governor of all things, and who is the only proper object of religious worship.

We believe that there are three persons in the Godhead - the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost, undivided in essence and co-equal in power and glory.

We believe that in the person of Jesus Christ the Divine and human natures are united, so that he is truly and properly God and truly and properly man.

We believe that our first parents were created in a state of innocency, but by their disobedience they lost their purity and happiness, and that in consequence of their fall all men have become sinners, totally depraved, and as such are justly exposed to the wrath of God.

We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ has by his suffering and death made an atonement for the whole world so that whosoever will may be saved.

We believe that repentance towards God, faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, and regeneration by the Holy Spirit, are necessary to salvation.

We believe that we are justified by grace through faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and that he that believeth hath the witness in himself.

We believe that continuance in a state of salvation depends upon continued obedient faith in Christ.

We believe that it is the privilege of all believers to be wholly sanctified, and that their whole spirit and soul and body may be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We believe in the immortality of the soul; in the resurrection of the body; in the general judgement at the end of the world; in the eternal happiness of the righteous; and in the endless punishment of the wicked.

What is a 'covenant with God'?

A covenant is a promise or commitment between people and God, made possible by God's grace. Because we love God and want to stay close to him, and with the help of the Holy Spirit, we choose to live in a way that helps grow God's Kingdom on earth. God is always faithful, and in response we are called to show his love in every part of our lives. Even though we still struggle with sin, God's grace and the power of the Holy Spirit make it possible for us to return to and renew this relationship with him. Making a covenant with God marks the start of a new chapter in a person's spiritual journey.

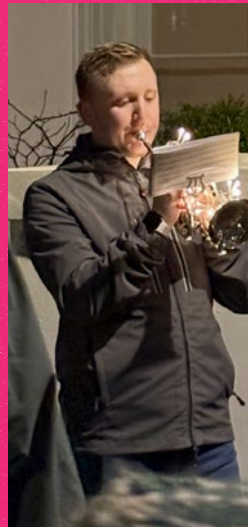

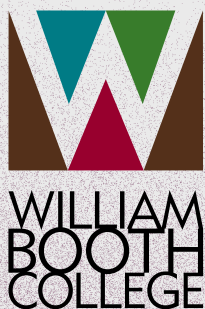


As we reflect on our various training experiences, the Keepers of the Covenant would like to take this opportunity to thank a number of people who have supported us on our journeys:
